

# Texas Primary Delegate Fact Sheet



## Breaking it Down

4,049	Total National Delegates
796	Total National Superdelegates
2,025	Total needed to nominate
1,998	Total left
1,202	Total if Superdelegates subtracted
67.8%	Total percent of remaining Barack needs without his “current” portion (30%) of Superdelegates.
54.9%	Total percent of remaining Barack needs with his portion of Superdelegates included.

193	Total number of delegates in Texas
9.66%	Percent of remaining 1,998 National Delegates
126	Total number of delegates elected night of the caucus (reason to return to polling place in the evening after voting that morning)
18%	Percent of delegates awarded based on number who attend convention
32	Total number of Superdelegates appointed without voter input

**Getting to 200,000 votes:  $(1 + 10 + 40 + 120 + 240 + 240) \times 310 = 201,810$**

(Formula Explanation: 1 person find 10 people to vote for and caucus for Barack who each in turn get 4, who each get three, who each get two, who each get 1 multiplied by 310 volunteers=201,810)
